Welcome to our eleventh **CENTAUR** Project Update!


In this issue, we look back on a very busy month and share what's next for the CENTAUR Horizon Europe project.

What has CENTAUR been up to?

April was a busy month for the CENTAUR team! The team participated in leading events across the Earth Observation and emergency management sectors, while also advancing key activities of the project. Here is some of the highlights:

Copernicus EMS Global Flood Forecasting & Monitoring Meeting

In early April, we participated in the Copernicus Emergency Management Service (CEMS) Global Flood Forecasting and Monitoring Annual Meeting. During the session 'Short talks: GloFAS and GFM use cases and applications', we presented an overview of CENTAUR and outlined current progress, highlighting the development of two composite indexes and eleven indicators for urban flood risk.

Key Project Milestone: Cold Cases and Demo Results Evaluation


We recently reached a significant milestone in the project. The consortium presented the outcomes of the Demo Review for Cold Cases (DR-CC) and the Preliminary Demo Results Evaluation (PDRE) to the Advisory Board. This session reviewed the implementation of cold cases (historical crisis scenarios) and assessed findings which will guide the next phase of development.

A new publication, developed as part of the activities under the CENTAUR project, "ERA5-Drought: Global Drought Indices Based on ECMWF Reanalysis", was recently published in Scientific Data. This paper introduces a high-resolution global dataset which has already been applied within CENTAUR's food and water security track to assess drought dynamics in Somalia, Mali, and Mozambique.
